Doug and I joined Adventure Lab through the Geocaching organization several years ago. Before Doug passed away this year, we completed quite a few Adventures both here and abroad.

We all want to keep traveling and an Adventure Lab activity offers this. The amount of walking varies lpha - for example the Adventure Lab at Ft. Douglas was about one mile. This can be a leisurely stroll. I read * recently the benefits of even a leisurely stroll. Additionally we all learned things we did not know about * Ft. Douglas! You have social interaction and the benefits of being outside as well.

I would like to invite FFI members to join me in a Wheeler Farm Adventure Lab on May 13th (Saturday), beginning at 9:00 A.M. We will complete the Adventure Lab first (about 30 minutes). The Farm is holding their annual Spring Farm Fest that day, and members are free to enjoy the Fest, or, get a cup of coffee and talk around the picnic tables on the grounds after our Adventure Lab experience.

The Adventure Lab has many benefits. Walking in particular has 5 crucial benefits:

- * 1. It counteracts the effects of weight-promoting genes.

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Geocaching

Web Geocaching is a treasure hunting game where you use a GPS to hide and seek containers with other participants in the activity. Geocaching.com is the listing service for geocaches around the world.



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Adventure geocaching is a new service provided by the parent company (Geocaching.com) that focuses on teaching participants about a specific location, much like a museum visit might have a cassette that explains exhibits. Using a simple app downloaded on your phone, participants are asked to record a fact found at each stop, or perhaps, solve a simple puzzle - adding some mild competition to the experience.

On Saturday April 15th, Margret Boes-Ingraham led a small intrepid group of FFI members on an Adventure Lab tour of Fort Douglas. Centered on the main parade ground of the Fort, we spent a very enjoyable 45 minutes walking to find the 5 historical sites. At each building we read the historical markers and information supplied in the Adventure Lab program, then answered a question about the information on the app.

There are about 34 of these Adventure Lab tours available in the greater Salt Lake City area. Margret and Susan (Hilton) both thought the Adventure Labs would be fun experiences not only for club guests but also as a potential FFI club activity with grandchildren in tow.

The applications are available on Google Play without cost. Both the Geocaching and the Adventure Lab need to be downloaded to your phone.

Can you help?

Our friend in Tanzania needs help. He is the director of Wendyrayna Secondary School in Iringa.

For more than two years Winston's Wendyrayna secondary school has had a serious food shortage for students and staff. The school is not run for profit but is a service for underprivileged children, so more than 80 percent of the access of running the school depends on the sponsors and the director. The school owns more than 60 acres of land where it was built. It also owns land in the villages of Mkalanga, Kilolo District, 100 acres, and Ipalamwa, 10 acres. Further, it plans to rent a 20-acre plot of land to grow rice, because rice needs so much water.

The school, seeks to purchase a farm tractor with its equipment to include a 4-disc plough, 20-disc harrow, a multi-planter and a trailer. This will enable students and staff to have access to nutritious meals at school and serve as an income -generating project. Let's get together and help eliminate malnutrition for our friends in Iringa, who will 🕋 host our members in October. Marvin will be collecting donations at the General Meeting on May 16th. 


Local Opportunities for May


