No wonder he and Marge became members of Friendship Force and are two of its best boosters.

INBOUND JOURNEY #25029: Oita, Japan, June 7th to 14th



Our club will host 10 Oita club members in June: 2 couples, 2 single men, and 4 single women. Our visitors range in age from 65-77, and beyond traveling, their interests include: music, cooking, photography, "walking in wild places," gardening, knitting, weaving, sewing, drawing, reading, table tennis, regular tennis, theater, golf, hiking, calligraphy, gym workouts, and playing musical instruments (the flute and ocarina). Many of these visitors do speak some English and have been to the U.S. before, but it is always helpful to download the free Google Translate app on your phone for clearer communication.

The FF Oita Club is one of 26 clubs in Japan. Founded in 1988, the Oita Club has 23 members who actively host and travel internationally. Oita is a coastal prefecture (county) on Kyushu, the southernmost island of Japan. It has a population of 1,136,245 and is known

for its thermal hot springs and scenic Mt. Yufu. Club members are mainly from the rural city of Taketa (population 19,456), surrounded by lush green valleys, mountains, and majestic bamboo groves.

After their week with our club, they will fly to Colorado for a stay with the Pikes Peak Club for another 7 days before returning to Japan.
